Guest editorial

On 1 December I put forward my Mayoral Proposal for Auckland Council’s 10-year Budget 2021-2031. It’s very different from the budget I had in mind at the start of this year. Prior to COVID-19, I had hoped that the 2021 10-year Budget would build aggressively on the infrastructure projects we had started in 2018. These had brought forward the clean-up of Auckland’s beaches and harbours by 20 years over previous plans and had accelerated the construction of critical infrastructure for housing and transport. However, COVID-19 has savagely cut Auckland Council’s income, as it has that of Aucklanders and Auckland businesses. The virus and lockdowns have reduced council income by \$450 million and by 2024 we are expecting cumulative income losses of \$1 billion.

In response to this challenge, we first have the obligation to manage our finances prudently and responsibly. We have to live within our means. But this budget is not about slashing services and stopping work on critical infrastructure projects. An austerity budget would make Auckland’s recession worse rather than stimulate recovery, and cause long-term damage to the services and infrastructure Aucklanders rely on.

We need to keep investing in our communities, our infrastructure and

our environment. But if we are to spend more in these areas, we also have to find economies by becoming leaner and more efficient. We have reduced staff numbers, constrained salaries and deferred lower-priority projects. This year we are making savings of \$120 million.

My Mayoral Proposal for the 10-year Budget includes the following key measures:

- Increasing value for money and savings efforts to lock in permanently \$90 million of the savings made in this year’s Emergency Budget
- Continuing to sell surplus properties to realise \$70 million a year for three years, and reinvesting these proceeds in priority infrastructure
- Increasing our debt to revenue borrowing from 270 per cent to a temporarily higher level of up to 290 per cent in the first three years, which is not expected to affect our credit rating
- A long-term commitment to a 3.5 per cent rates increase, with a one-off increase of 5 per cent next year to help meet the crisis caused by the pandemic
- Climate change commitments of \$150 million to mitigate carbon emissions, including immediately halting the purchase of diesel buses and ensuring any new bus is electric or hydrogen-powered, planting millions of native trees as carbon

sinks and planning for coastal change.

As a result of this budget, we will be able to invest around \$900 million more into transport, housing, water and environmental infrastructure over the next three years. It will create new transport and water assets and meet the costs of maintaining vital community assets.

It will increase total capital investment over 10 years from \$26 billion to \$31 billion.

This will both stimulate construction, jobs and economic recovery, as well as creating long-term assets for the city. It will allow us to continue projects such as Lake Road, Glenvar Road and the Northern Busway extension, new cycleways and the infrastructure required to meet Auckland’s housing shortage.

I accept that this budget will not be all things to all people. Many people would have liked to see us spend more. Others will call for us to slash more services or further delay critical investments.

However, I believe this proposal walks the line between ensuring our city is able to recover quickly from the effects of the pandemic and the lockdowns while also limiting costs that Aucklanders would otherwise face.

It is a recovery budget that will keep our city moving while ensuring that costs to ratepayers are fair and reasonable.

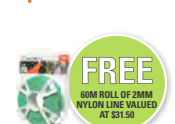

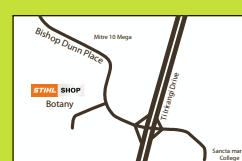

College student's artwork makes it to world stage

Her artwork has been published in a book by JK Rowling this year, and now Whitford teenager Morgan Alley has had a piece of work selected for the international Lions Peace Poster competition.

Thirteen-year-old Morgan has just completed her last year at Somerville Intermediate School. During this year's Covid-19 lockdown, she entered a competition open to children aged 7-12 from around the world to illustrate JK Rowling's 'The Ickabog' - a story serialised by the author of the Harry Potter series which was released online to entertain families confined at home. Morgan's artwork was one of 34 selected from more than 18,000 entries from around the world to be published in the UK edition of the hardcover book.

"I couldn't believe it when I found out that my illustration was chosen as I am a huge fan of JK Rowling's books," says Morgan. "The book was released on 10 November this year and it's really exciting visiting book shops and seeing my illustration in print. I got to go on the AM Show which was exciting and I received a signed copy of JK Rowling's book as well as \$1000 worth of books that I was able to donate to Somerville Intermediate's library."

Morgan's joy at being published in such a high profile book was then further boosted by learning that another piece of her artwork had been selected as the New Zealand entry in the Lions Peace Poster

competition, which is run in conjunction with the United Nations.

Her work (pictured right) uses a medic helping someone in need to portray the competition's theme of 'peace through service'. Morgan says the poster took around 14 hours to complete, using a combination of watercolour paints and colouring pencils.

"I wanted my poster to be relatable, so no matter where you are from, you can interpret and connect with it. I included a dove flying in the sky holding an olive branch because it is a universal symbol that represents peace. I wanted my background to be dull and lifeless because it seems to stretch on forever and make the girl seem small and insignificant. However even when you feel alone, there is always someone there to guide you which is why the medic is there, supporting the girl when she needs it most."

Morgan says peace is one of the most important things to our world. "We must make sure it's maintained. Everyone needs to know how important peace is so positivity can be spread and violence eliminated. People need to respect and show kindness to one another and embrace what makes us unique and different."

Creativity and an eye for detail must run in the family. Morgan's sister, Mackenzie, successfully entered the same competition in 2018.

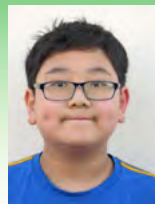

Next-level amenities define Pohutukawa Landing

Metlifecare's new retirement village on the Pohutukawa Coast is under construction, offering an unmatched living environment.

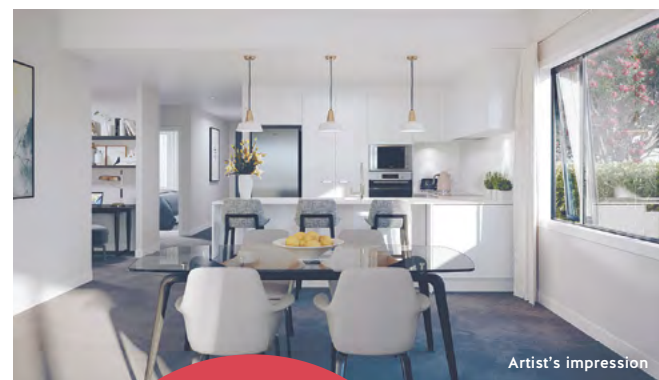

COP SHOP NEWS

Well it's that time of year again and Saint Nick is knocking on the door.

It is also the time that our community becomes a target.

Your local police have taken a proactive approach to the upcoming festive season, however we still need the ongoing support and buy in from our community.

The yearly "Op Beaches" will be run again this year from 21 December until Waitangi Day 2021. You will see a large influx of police in our area ranging from your Public Safety teams, Road Policing, District and Area Prevention Units. In excess of 20 police per day will be rostered to work throughout Op Beaches.

At any time, we will be conducting random alcohol and licence checkpoints,

beach patrols targeting anti-social behaviour, local liquor ban breaches and focusing on reducing harm and trauma on our roads.

But I still need your help.

I receive many grumbles from residents regarding what is NZ Police doing to deter the disorder, the drinking, fighting and parking and the rubbish left behind at the end of each day?

My advice as always is to report it in the first instance. Don't think someone else will. You are the someone else. If Auckland Council, Auckland Parking, or Police are not aware you need help and where the help is needed, we can't assist you. We will respond.

Auckland Transport and Auckland Council have also been proactive and are in the process of replacing or adding additional rubbish bins. Damaged liquor ban signs will be replaced and roadside liquor ban signs will be erected on the routes leading into the Pohutukawa Coast informing motorists of the liquor ban area.

With summer also comes an increase of dishonesty offending reports and this includes burglaries and thefts from vehicles.

The goods most attractive to burglars and thieves (sometimes referred to as 'hot property') are small, valuable, easily taken and concealed, and easily disposed of because they are popular and sought after. These include items such as car

GPS units, jewellery, tools, iPods, mobile phones, handheld, laptop computers and game consoles.

I have been actively promoting "Operation SNAP" (Serial Number Action Partnership). This free initiative enables anyone to record serial numbers and other unique identifying details of their valuable goods. Details are securely stored in an electronic database from where they can be quickly and easily retrieved by owners to give to Police if property is lost or stolen. This assists recovery of stolen goods and identifying of burglars and thieves. For more information and to register your goods, visit www.SNAP.org.nz

Beachlands Police have also received several enquiries from property owners regarding issues with tenants and where the owners have found various levels of

methamphetamine use present inside the house.

Police advice is to report it to us through 105, and consider contacting the tenancy tribunal for assistance and further direction.

Also consider having your property professionally managed for peace of mind. If you're unable to do that, be vigilant, security vet and reference check the tenant and proposed occupants prior to the start of the tenancy and make sure that a Meth test is completed prior to the start and end of a tenancy agreement. And lastly, make sure your insurance covers this type of incident.

Finally, from myself, Hamish and the NZ Police, have a very Merry Christmas. Be safe, keep safe.

Keeping chooks healthy throughout summer

Here's a few handy tips on keeping our feathered friends comfortable this summer.

Chickens rely on cold water and shade to keep cool over the hot period. Heat stress can be seen as a bird panting and lying with its wings out in an attempt to cool down. As a result of this heat stress, chickens may stop preening, go limp and not move around. Serious overheating can also lead to open mouth breathing, a decrease in egg production, and potentially death.

The best way to prevent your chickens from overheating is to provide easy access to cool, clean fresh water and shade. Ensure water is in a clean container as birds will drink more from clean



water sources and can drink 2-4 times more than normal in the heat.

It's a good idea if chickens don't have access to natural shade e.g., trees or shrubs, to use shade cloth or covered areas for shade. Ensure food and water is easily accessible in the shaded areas and don't forget to have multiple containers available for birds lower in the pecking order.

As mite numbers increase in warmer weather, you may start to see signs of mite infestation in your chickens. The signs differ depending on the mite but display as damaged combs and wattles, scaly legs, pale combs, feather loss and damaged skin. Mites themselves may be seen on chickens, their perches, or eggs.

Aside from the clinical signs mentioned, you may also see increased feed requirements and decreased egg laying. This is caused by anaemia, which when significant can result in death.

Gratitude - the gift that comes back to you

Shopping malls and online retailers are busy with people clamouring to buy gifts as Christmas fast approaches.

But there's one gift we can give that costs nothing but has value beyond price, and actually benefits the giver as much as it does the receiver. That's the gift of gratitude. I'm not talking about a simple "Thank you", but a deeper, emotional connection that becomes a defining moment in the lives of the giver and the receiver.

Think of someone you know who's contributed to making your life better in some way. It could be a family member, friend, boss or co-worker. Now write them a letter of gratitude. It should be very specific, saying exactly what they did for you and how it affected you in a positive way. About 300 words is the right length. Then, ideally, hand deliver it. If that's not possible, mail it to them.

I wrote my first gratitude letter in 2016 as part of my training to become a positive psychology coach. It was to someone who's been a mentor, guide and sounding board for many years,

never asking for anything in return for his wisdom and patience. At first, it felt very awkward. But in writing it, I relived the many experiences that I value so highly. Posting the letter was also a challenge. Would it lead to embarrassment or awkwardness between us?

It was nearly two weeks before he responded. "I haven't been able to call you till now, Yvonne, because each time I look at your letter, I feel so overwhelmed. With joy." We still talk about that letter occasionally. Each time he mentions it, I get another whoosh of elation.

Many of my clients have also written gratitude letters, always with the same outcome - a deep sense of lasting pleasure.

Finally, to my coaching clients of 2020 - you have my sincere gratitude. Thank you for allowing me to partner with you on your journeys of self-discovery and change. I wish all the clients I've coached and those I've yet to meet a very happy Christmas, and a fabulous 2021.

Men of the Coast offer support

With the onset of Covid-19 and associated lockdowns hitting hard, 2020 has had a detrimental effect on the wellbeing of many men.

Maraetai local Chris Philpott recognised the symptoms of depression after hitting "rock bottom" a couple of years ago and was inspired recently to form a peer-led group called 'Men of the Coast' to help others struggling with mental health issues.

Chris says he was "angry a lot, I was disillusioned with where I was in my career and my life, and I was ready to just give up on my job and my life in Auckland, and go somewhere new."

His wife convinced him to see a doctor for a proper diagnosis. He was prescribed a daily anti-depressant and sessions with a therapist.

Chris now hopes that 'Men of the Coast' can provide a place for attendees to go and just be themselves in the company of other men who are going through the same things they are.

One of the groups' objectives is to provide an outlet for men who traditionally can be reluctant to show their emotions and share their internal battles.

"With the kind of year that 2020 has been - with lockdowns, limited social gatherings, and even the working from home strategy many workplaces (including mine) have adopted - it has meant increased isolation," says Chris.

"I think for men - and really anyone - talking openly can be an incredibly brave and powerful act. As men, we tend to disregard our feelings and struggle with talking about what and how we feel."

"There is real power in being able to speak your truth, and then have other men agree with you and sympathise with you and encourage you. In terms of longer-term outcomes and group format choices, my intention is not to lead the group - it's a democracy in that way, so each session will be very much run by the group as a whole and centred around the needs of all."

Being based local to Beachlands, Maraetai and surrounding areas was important to Chris as he feels it provides social opportunities to area new-comers, coupled with its other objective.

"Three-quarters of those attending the first meeting were men who've been in the area for less than two years, so it also provides a place to meet others from the area, and potentially create friendships," he says.

The group meets every second Thursday night at 7pm at the committee room at Te Puru Community centre. They will be taking a break for Christmas, but the group will be back into it in the new year.

Teen actor selected to perform on stage at the London Globe

Seventeen year old Lily Moore is one local resident with special reason to hope world travel is possible again next year.

Lily is one of 24 secondary school students in the country to be selected by the Youth Shakespeare Company (YSC) to attend a three-week trip to the UK where she will perform on the famous London Globe Stage.

The Howick College student says she very nearly fell over when she received news of her selection.

“There were lots of tears, and in all honesty, I still can’t really believe it,” says Lily. “This sort of thing is once in a lifetime, and I am just so so grateful and humbled by this beautiful opportunity.”

Lily was selected for the trip after Howick College won the regional heats of the Shakespeare Globe Centre New Zealand University of Otago Sheliah Winn Shakespeare Festival. Howick College went on to participate in the national festival, held online this year, with their student-directed piece of ‘Antony and Cleopatra’, in which Lily played Cleopatra. Both Lily and fellow Howick College thespian Jenna Feldman (who played Octavius) won regional and national recognition at the national festival, and were selected to spend an intensive week in Dunedin as a part of the National Schools’ Shakespeare Production.

“Throughout that week in September/October we participated in workshops, rehearsals - and excruciating line learning - with insurmountably talented students from all over the country in preparation for our production at the end of the week,” says Lily. “I appeared in ‘King John’ directed by Alexander Sparrow, it was the best week of my life. From there, 24 of the 48 National Schools Shakespeare students were selected to be a part of Shakespeare Globe Centre New Zealand’s Youth Shakespeare Company, representing New Zealand in London next July on The Globe Stage.”

The intensive three-week trip will include workshops, performance rehearsals and the opportunity to put questions about Shakespeare’s plays to some of the Globe’s leading actors and directors. Lily says she will also get to participate in behind the scene tours of the Globe, Rose and National Theatres, Royal Albert Hall and Stratford upon Avon. After watching others perform at the Globe and other theatres in London, Lily and her trip-mates will take to the Globe Stage themselves, performing one of Shakespeare’s plays for The Young Shakespeare Company.

“It’s an absolute dream come true,” says Lily. “I only ever thought I would just

dream of performing on the Globe stage. Stepping on that stage will be so surreal. I made friends for life during my time in Dunedin, and I can’t wait to share this unbelievable experience with some of the most extraordinary people I’ve ever met.”

Lily has been involved with numerous theatre productions since she was 12-years-old. She enrolled in drama classes when she first entered Howick College, and credits much of her success to her “phenomenal” drama teacher, Jillian Dryden. Lily says there are many reasons she loves performing, including storytelling, bringing people joy, the people she meets, and the rush of a live audience. “It’s all I want to do. During one of our darkest years, we all turned to the arts; films, television, therapeutic painting, music, dance. I think it’s safe

to say that we would all be lost without the arts.”

Borders and pandemic permitting, the trip is set to go ahead next July, though if Covid interrupts next year’s plan, the trip will be postponed for as long as it needs to be.

In the meantime, Lily says she is actively seeking sponsorships to help her fundraise for what will be her first trip overseas. “I have already had kind offers of support from some wonderful local organisations and locals – I feel so lucky to live in such a caring community. I have just started a local job and will be doing movie fundraisers, bake sales and performance fundraisers, so watch this space.”

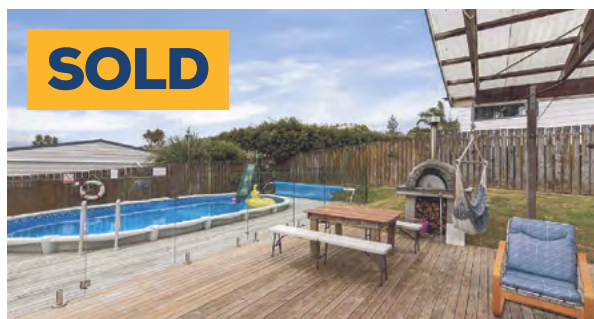

Entries sought for Auckland Anniversary Day regatta

Entries are invited for 181st time to take part in NZ's oldest regatta

The Ports of Auckland Anniversary Day Regatta may not be the cutting edge clash of titans that the America's Cup will be. But Auckland's annual celebratory regatta can lay claim to being the older of the two events, pre-dating the challenge for the Auld Mug by over a decade.

One of the oldest sailing events in the world, the Ports of Auckland Anniversary Day Regatta traces its origins back to 1840 on the day Captain William Hobson's officials raised the flag - 11 years before the first America's Cup contest was sailed in 1851.

The Auckland Anniversary Regatta's own historic trophy collection, on permanent display at the Maritime Museum, is valued at nearly \$100,000. There are 14 trophies in the collection dating back to the 19th century, and every year the winners' names are engraved on their division's trophy, securing their place in maritime history forever.

Organisers are anticipating a boost in both entries and spectators for the regatta's 181st edition on 1 February 2021, as the City of Sails gears up for a spectacular summer of maritime events. With the regatta scheduled to take place between semi-finals events in the PRADA Cup, followed by the 36th America's Cup, and alongside the RNZYS 150th anniversary

celebrations, there are high hopes for renewed interest in the historic spectacle.

Executive Officer for the regatta, Joyce Talbot, says those planning to be in Auckland for the 2021 regatta will have "a unique chance to see one of the world's largest fleets of lovingly and authentically restored classic yachts and launches, alongside the most groundbreaking sailing technology in the world".

Participants needn't have a multi-million dollar budget to take up the challenge, with boats of all shapes and sizes encouraged to take to the water to celebrate the founding of the City of Sails.

There are divisions for classic and modern keelboats, mullet boats, and passage races for yachts in 'cruising trim'. A classic launch race gives the owners of several beautifully restored powerboats a great excuse to parade their labours of love in front of an audience, while the tugboat race and display is a much-loved crowd favourite.

Over 20 different dinghy, kite and board sailing classes are catered for at host clubs across the city, including Murray's Bay, Takapuna, Manly and Tamaki. While in the calmer waters of the Viaduct, Westhaven and St Marys Bay, dragonboat crews and radio controlled yacht enthusiasts will join those battling it out for victory and prizes.

Entry fees are kept as low as possible to

encourage broad participation, and most of the funds are awarded back to participants as prizes. Together with a host of spot prizes, the prize pool for the regatta frequently totals over \$10,000 in value.

For those staying on dry land for Anniversary Day, watching the regatta is a time-honoured family tradition in the city. Families are urged to grab a picnic and

head down to one of the many great viewing points around Auckland's coastline, to watch all the action unfold.

Simple salads for festive season entertaining

Red and Green Salads

Make it a red salad, or a green salad - but not both! The simplicity of each colour on a plate, and the balanced flavours, speak for themselves.

Red Salad:

Fresh tomatoes with grilled capsicum served with olive oil and basil on top. Serve with your favourite mozzarella or bocconcini.

Green Salad:

Cucumber, spinach leaves, lightly steamed broccoli, lightly steamed asparagus served with an avocado and sesame seeds.

Raw Courgette Salad

Ingredients

- 4 courgettes
- 1 lemon
- 2 cloves of garlic
- 2 Tbsp of yoghurt

Grate courgettes into a bowl
Squeeze over lemon juice
Add crushed garlic
Mix through yoghurt and pine nuts and serve.

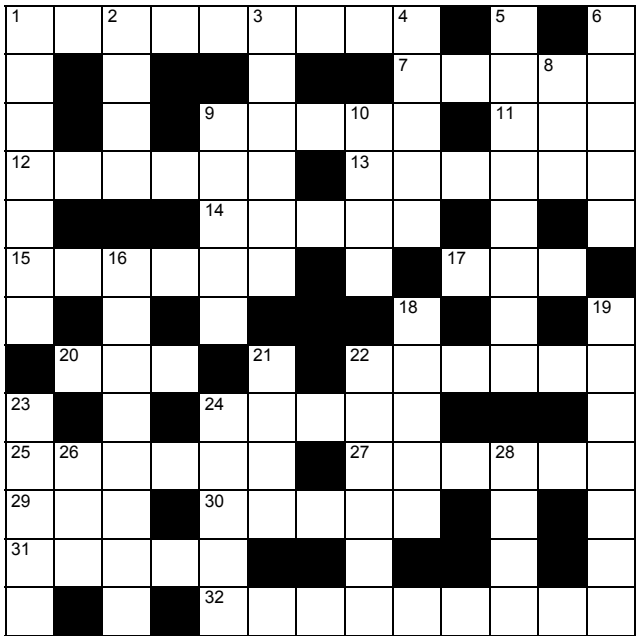

Dotterel Diary

The 2020-2021 dotterel breeding season in our area is so far going well. We currently have two dotterel pairs breeding at Te Puru sports field/Kellys Beach. The first pair started nesting at the start of October and two chicks hatched in early November.

Young dotterel fledge (can fly) after around six to seven weeks. The Te Puru chicks are doing well, growing their adult plumage, and will be able to fly in a couple weeks.

The second Te Puru pair started nesting at the end of November and are currently incubating three eggs.

Over at Duder Regional Park on the Umupuia beach front, a pair of dotterel also very recently started nesting. Luckily, a bach user spotted the nest shortly after the eggs were laid and the area was quickly fenced off, otherwise it could have easily been trampled.

The next dotterel update will not be until late January, when there will hopefully be new dotterel chicks to report on.
