Guest editorial

Thank you to all who visited Beachlands Countdown, the PCCA-hosted Ambrosia Café event, or who dropped in at the Clevedon District Centre to talk about our 2020 Franklin Local Board Plan.

Malcolm, Lance and I enjoy meeting residents, to hear ideas and understand your priorities for our area.

That's why it's important as many of you as possible engage with our plan, which sets out our direction for the next three years. It also helps to inform the whole board.

While the plan has been shaped by your feedback, getting it to a draft stage and bringing it back to you means we can understand if the path we are on reflects what you want.

In the past, your input has helped get things done. Kahawairahi Park, Sunkist's new toilets, picnic area and pathways, Wairoa river restoration, and pest control workshops are all based on community feedback.

Consultation is open to 13 August and there are many ways to get involved. The simplest is on our Franklin Local Board Facebook page, where you can leave a comment, although you must use the hashtag #lovelocal to make your remarks official. Without that we can't take your comments as feedback.

There are links to the Have Your Say

site too. If you prefer, you can download survey forms or complete hard copies that are available at libraries and service centres.

It's staggering how much growth is forecast for Franklin, and the challenges that will bring. In Clevedon alone, growth could be as high as 600 per cent over the next decade, and you only need turn around in Beachlands to see new homes rising.

There's a lot in the plan about our area, especially around transport, which we all continue to hear is a big concern for you.

Some things we can directly influence because we make the decisions, others we can only advocate to the council's governing body, CCOs or the Government on your behalf.

Transport is a big part of our advocacy role.

The year ahead, and possibly beyond, will pose challenges as we contend with the impact of Covid-19. It's already seen big cuts to council budgets, job losses - with more forecast, and an Emergency Budget. All capital projects for next year have been deferred unless they are under contract.

Fortunately, the budget made savings and concessions that will allow many of the services you value, such as libraries and community facilities to operate, and money was redirected to continue to fund

our board's discretionary budgets.

Even so, there will be challenges.

All of which makes hearing from you important to understand the priorities and know what you want to focus on.

Our chair Andy Baker says a strong plan is critical, and your Wairoa members agree with that. Ultimately it is about wanting to use local strengths to generate prosperity for local people, getting better transport options, having community places and facilities that meet our needs, and recognising and protecting Franklin's cultural and Māori heritage.

Kawakawa Bay back on port relocation agenda

The possibility of relocating Auckland's port to Kawakawa Bay was resurrected late last month in a newly released report.

The latest report by independent consultants Sapere confirms the findings of an earlier report in 2016 which was reported on by the PC Times.

That report suggested the Manukau Harbour as a preferred option, while a port located in the Firth of Thames - at Kawakawa Bay - was mentioned as a viable alternative.

It is estimated that Auckland's port will outgrow its current downtown Auckland location in 30-40 years. Over the past decade a number of reports have been commissioned which explore alternative options including Northland, Tauranga, the Manukau Harbour or Firth of Thames.

In the recent Sapere report, three options for island-type ports located just off the coast of Kawakawa Bay are proposed.

The report says a new port on the Firth of Thames has some perceived advantages

in that its east coast location would be close to current shipping routes and close to landside supply chains around South Auckland and the Bay of Plenty. "There is sufficient natural depth and although the

route has complexities, navigating large vessels into the Firth of Thames is likely to be straightforward. The port's C-shape design and breakwaters would provide protection from waves in a relatively unprotected environment. While this raises the construction cost, this is balanced by the lack of need for dredging."

The findings of the earlier 2016 report suggested that a port located at Kawakawa Bay would be the most viable alternative to a west coast port, although an east coast location would lead to higher costs for land transport infrastructure and freight. A new four-lane roadway between Mill Road/State Highway 1 and Kawakawa Bay would need to be constructed, in addition to a new rail line built through challenging terrain. The report says the east coast location would also raise "important cultural, social and environmental" issues.

Experts remain convinced that the Manukau Harbour remains the best place to relocate the port, though a number of issues would require further investigation. A west coast shipping lane must take into account significant dredging that would need to be undertaken around the Manukau entrance bar. The 2016 study suggested that west coast weather conditions could lead to the port being closed occasionally - an issue that would be compounded by more frequent adverse weather events associated with climate

change. However the independent consultants remain positive that none of these issues are insurmountable, and that the Manukau port is the most viable option.

The government has said it will only make a decision about the port's location after it has undertaken thorough policy analysis, which would only take place after the upcoming election.

The final decision could be influenced by large international shipping companies which favour the Firth of Thames option.

The report says: "Shipping company representatives affirmed a preference for a new port at the Firth of Thames as an alternative to POAL [Ports of Auckland Ltd]. It is thought the Firth of Thames option can viably co-exist with the Port of Tauranga, from a shipping logistics perspective. The rationale is that a new port on the Firth of Thames would be positioned to feed into South Auckland, Hamilton/Waikato and Tauranga/Bay of Plenty and further south, handling imports and exports."

The report goes on to say: "Ultimately, shipping lines will call where the main

ports are located, while preferring to take the lower cost option, where available."

Provided it ticks environmental boxes, the east coast port option has also received support from Hauraki and Thames-Coromandel district mayors who see it as a boon for local employment.

When approached by the *PC Times* for

comment in 2016, the Kawakawa Bay Community Association said the community was opposed to the idea of a port on their doorstep. Reasons included infrastructure cost, the impact on tourists to the area, and the impact on recreational and non-commercial users of the gulf.

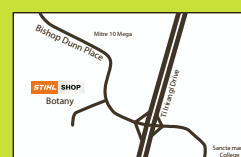

# Election Special: an interview with Judith Collins

In the lead-up to the election, the *PC Times* will speak to the candidates contesting the Papakura electorate. This week we start with National Party Leader Judith Collins.



**If you win the Papakura electorate seat again in this year's election, what are your broader goals for the electorate over the next 3 years?**

My immediate focus will be New Zealand's transport connectivity with emphasis on Auckland, Resource Management Act reforms, Mill Road widening, extending the passenger train services to Pokeno by 2024 and getting a busway to Botany

and a train service to the Airport. Getting National's Development Plan Bill passed and starting the work to improve our railway connectivity for passengers and for freight is a huge priority. An important aim is to reduce traffic congestion because this will reduce people's and businesses' costs as well as helping them to spend less time travelling and more time doing productive jobs.

In Papakura itself and indeed across the country National will be working to support our economy and the foundation of it which is all agriculture and food producing activities. As well, we will be supporting small businesses who employ many people and have the capacity to grow.

**What are the key issues you think are important to residents living in the eastern rural and coastal settlements of the Papakura electorate?**

In parts of Papakura housing, all infrastructure but especially transport, schools, healthcare and addressing coastal erosion, are important issues. National and I will be encouraging top end tourism and no freedom camping. But as your MP a big part of my job is to listen to what my constituents want and then to see how I can help them achieve their goals.

**How do you see yourself making headway with these issues?**

As Leader it is my job to have the plan and to prioritise the issues. At the top of our agenda is helping Aucklanders to get where they need to be without getting stuck in traffic at any time of the day or night. I will rely on my constituents to tell me of more immediate issues and I have already heard about the need for more secondary school options in the areas where there is new housing. I am really aware that Auckland has the greatest population in the country and really needs some new facilities to anticipate further growth.

**The issues experienced by residents of Papakura township are likely to be quite different to issues experienced by Pohutukawa Coast and rural residents. How do you plan to keep everyone happy?**

By asking people to bring their issues to me, keeping up with local people and local events and holding clinics at my electorate office I am sure there will be continue to be opportunity for people to have their individual issues addressed.

**A high school is something our area needs. Hundreds of local children travel along our dangerous roads each day to access secondary schools in east-Auckland and the city. Do you think you can convince the MOE that it is time to secure land and start planning a high school for our area?**

A lot depends on who forms the next Government in regard to establishing new schools in the Papakura Electorate. Irrespective I am very much in support of children attending schools in their neighbourhoods and I support having schools of special character, private schools and public schools available for our local communities. If National were to form the next government these things would be given a very high priority but I am also very determined to lobby and ask difficult questions if needed, as you probably know.

**How would you describe your relationship with Ngai Tai ki Tamaki,**

**and how do you plan to honour the principles of Te Tiriti by working with them in future?**

My door is always open to local Iwi. I would be open to standing National candidates in the Maori seats as I think it is time we had a voice in these seats again. I think this would encourage Maori accessibility to National and that is a good thing. I am a person who depends on having full understanding of the issues and the facts about a matter from all interested parties. Communication, compromise and cooperation are words that I would apply to all situations where there are parties with opposing views. The Treaty of Waitangi is a constitutional document for New Zealand and I studied it in depth as part of being a lawyer in a past life. I am very aware of its content and effect.

**Will your current ranking within the National Party be an advantage to our area, or are we likely to see less of you because you spend so much time in Wellington/dealing with party business?**

It is always my intention to serve the people in the Papakura Electorate and much of my time in Parliament in Wellington, behind the scenes is doing just that. The advent of emails and social media mean that all of us are enabled to be in touch and contacted very easily. I think that the Covid-19 lockdown was a great opportunity to realise that the work could go on as usual no matter where I am located. I know that during that time my constituents were heard and their issues were dealt with promptly. So I think we can see that physical presence is not essential to getting matters heard and resolved these days.

**What National Party policies are most likely to provide opportunities and benefits to residents of the Pohutukawa Coast, Clevedon and Hunua areas?**

I think that National's first policy announcement to smash congestion on our roads and to improve public transport will have a huge benefit for the Pohutukawa

# Election Special: an interview with Judith Collins

Coast residents. As you will know from our announcement of the Development Planning Bill, National wants to work on Auckland's roads, trains and ferry services so that commuting takes around 30 minutes and you can get across town in an hour.

**Should residents expect to see you door-knocking in the area any time soon, and/or are you offering any opportunities for people to meet with you?**

Yes door knocking and probably a public meeting. And there is a meet the candidates on Wednesday 2 September at 5.30pm in Papakura at the Papakura Rugby Club, Ron Keat Drive.

**You've recently published a memoir - what spurred the decision to write it? What has the reaction to the book been like? How many copies have you sold?**

I was really excited to write my book because I wanted to tell my story in my own words! I decided to give it a really good go after I finished my Diploma in Health and Safety Management through Massey University last October. I have been overwhelmed by the really positive reaction to it from all sorts of people. The

first print run sold in less than three days and it has been reprinted three more times since making it the top selling book for this year so far. I think that 12500 copies have been sold and I did a book signing at Whitcoulls in Papakura Town Centre on the last Saturday in July that was just fantastic and went on way beyond the allotted time. Ouch, the cramp from all that signing - but I just love that people are so enthusiastic to get the book and read it.

**National has proposed a \$31b road-ing project connecting Auckland to Northland if it is elected, and has promised to increase ferry services in Auckland - how does the National Party propose to implement these projects which would typically fall under the independent ownership of NZTA and Auckland Transport respectively?**

I was really excited to announce the reality of the four lane expressway from Northland via Auckland to Tauranga on 17 July.

I know that the Northland Regional Transport Committee chair John Bain is right behind this plan. To pay for the work which is part of a 20 year vision a significant change would be made in the way that NZTA pays for projects. National

would encourage it to borrow on its own balance sheet and pay back the debt over 20 to 30 years. My colleague Chris Bishop NZTA has an asset base of \$26 billion a year in state highways and revenue of \$4 billion a year in fuel tax so it would be like a household taking out a mortgage. National would also take money from the Covid-19 response budget and from the National Land Transport Fund and use future capital allowances from the government. National would take budgeted light rail money and put it into highways and public transport with busways to the northwest and east and rail to the airport.

It will be eight years before the second harbour crossing construction would begin and so there is plenty of time to work out the funding for this and for the tunnels the new expressway will need north and south of Auckland.

**Can you give a brief outline of the key measures the National Party would adopt to address New Zealand's two largest immediate challenges - Covid-19 and climate change?**

We would continue to keep up the current border controls and quarantine, isolation measures but would introduce a charge of up to \$3,000 for a two week isolation stay

in an approved isolation hotel.

The Covid-19 situation is still a really big and dangerous risk for us and for the world. And developments need to be monitored including the development of an effective vaccine which we want to obtain for New Zealanders.

Regarding climate change I think that the greatest issue for the Pohutukawa Coast is the risk of coastal erosion and inundation due to high tides. Protection of food producing land in many parts of the Papakura Electorate is also of great importance as we once again focus on food production and export for economic growth.

We would want a top level scientific investigation into the effect of climate change on NZ and recommendations on how best to deal with keeping our rivers, lakes and coastal waters clean, potable and pristine. We want to speed up initiatives and processes by replacing the RMA with new up-to-date legislation that allows all manner of development in housing and infrastructure to happen quickly.

We also want to fast track electrification of the vehicle fleet and will look at a range of measures to do this. The result will be cleaner air, lower cost of fuel imports and an adherence to the Zero Carbon Act which we will continue support but it needs amendment to make it work.

# Why bother giving feedback on Franklin Local Board's Plan?

Thank you to the lively and engaged crowd of over 50 people who came to the Pohutukawa Coast Community Association's Have Your Say event on Saturday 25 July at Ambrosia.

Deputy mayor and Franklin ward councillor Bill Cashmore and Franklin Local Board representatives Malcolm Bell and Lance Gedge helped field many and varied questions from the audience on ferries, roads, public transport, water, a high school, development and local trails. The feedback whiteboards show that our local community want Franklin Local Board to focus on public transport, improving roads and planning and development that supports local communities and retains local character.

Auckland Council provided funding for refreshments, and the inviting Ambrosia venue meant that people stayed to continue the discussion. It was a rare opportunity to be able to share local concerns directly with our elected representatives.

### So, why bother?

We have held the drop in session at Countdown, and the Have Your Say event. So why do we keep asking you to provide feedback? Although Local Boards don't have direct responsibility for roads, water, the local economy, recreation and

planning they do speak on behalf of their local communities to influence Auckland Council in all these areas.

This year, more than ever, Franklin Local Board needs your feedback. Auckland Council's Emergency Budget will frame their 10-year plan and local boards have had to review their priorities. If funding in certain areas is cut then there is the chance it may vanish for good.

If Franklin Local Board does not hear directly from you they will not know what is of most importance to you. You have until 13 August to make your voice heard.

The feedback form may not provide enough detail or space for you to include everything you want to say and the recommendation is that you add as many pages as you need as long as you include your name on each page.

**Not sure what you want to say or how to say it?**

Here are some ideas to help you:

- Economic development:**
- ensure that Beachlands/Maraetai is seen as a gateway and service centre for the Hunua Ranges Trail
  - continue to improve mobile and broadband connectivity
  - work with Film Auckland to boost local businesses and employment opportunities
  - support all initiatives that connect

- employers working locally to provide opportunities for young people
- **Improved transport:**
  - ensure road improvements are fit for purpose for heavily used rural roads
  - more ferries? Be specific: weekdays, weekends, times?
  - a bus service connecting to Pine Harbour
- Auckland Transport to fully engage with the community before any revised public transport timetables and trials
- publicise local businesses and attractions to encourage ferry use from CBD to Pine Harbour
- directions on how to access Beachlands Maraetai from Pine Harbour
- ferry sailings for special events
- public transport connections between Whitford, Beachlands and Clevedon
- develop Pohutukawa Coast Trails linking communities along the Coast

- Local development and facilities:**
- provide community and civic facilities for the already increased population and continued expected growth
  - ensure robust infrastructure, particularly waste water facilities, are in place before further development
  - new developments to fully consider the effects of climate change and aim to future proof

- Environment:**
- ensure wastewater facilities are compli-

- ant and do not pollute our waterways
- continue Predator Free 2050 and Kauri Dieback initiatives
- keep waste out of landfill and create local employment opportunities by developing a recycling centre

## COP SHOP NEWS

Moving to Alert Level 1, it has been business as usual for your local constables. Schools are open, many of us are back to work, and the local roads are busy teeming with traffic.

You may have noticed since the end of June that speed limits on the majority of our roads have changed to lower and safer speeds. It has been noted by your local police that some members of the community disagree with the speed limit change.

However, you may be interested to know that since the date of the speed limit change there have been 10 vehicle crash incidents as opposed to the same period of time last year, where 26 vehicle crash

incidents were reported to Police. This translates to a 62% decrease in vehicle crashes.

Although many of us in the community have the ability to drive at the previous higher speed limit, the lower speed limit is there to help address safer driving. Please be mindful that not only are your local police enforcing these new speed limits, but also the Counties Manukau East Road Policing team, and speed camera vans. The Pohutukawa Coast community has done a fantastic job of keeping our roads safer since the speed limit change, so let's keep it up!

Your local police also want to touch on the topic of the importance of the Crime Stoppers reporting line. With the help of Crimestoppers, the Police 105 reporting line, and the community reporting drug activity, your local police have executed 2 search warrants at local drug supplying addresses over the past 6 months.

Each search warrant has helped Police successfully lay a number of charges relating to the supply of illicit drugs such as methamphetamine and cultivation of cannabis. Although two search warrants have been carried out so far, police are currently looking into further local addresses and persons for the manufacture and supply of illicit drugs such as methamphetamine, MDMA, and cannabis.

The support and reporting that the local

community provides greatly assists the police with executing these search warrants and eradicating one by one the supply of the effect of drugs on our society. If you are aware of any suspicious activity local to you, we urge you to not hesitate to report this information via the Police 105 or Crimestoppers reporting lines.

Your local police look into each and every one of these reports with the intention to build cases and execute further search warrants to ultimately make the commu-

nity a safer place by stamping out the imbecility of these law-breaking individuals.

If you see us patrolling around the area, feel free to approach and talk to us.

Remember: if it is happening now, call Police on 111. If it has already happened, report it through 105 or with confidential information through Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111 or [www.crimestoppers-nz.org/about/contact-us](http://www.crimestoppers-nz.org/about/contact-us)

## Brookby Road surface causes more woes

Clevedon resident Monita Kumar contacted the *PC Times* after reading about the horse float which snapped its axle on the uneven surface of Brookby Road recently.

Monita says her fleet of trucks has also been impacted by the poor road surface. Two weeks ago, one of her trucks broke its rear springs along the same section of road. The following week, another of her trucks also broke its springs on the road and had to be sent to the repair shop.

Monita says the repair of both trucks has cost her company around \$10,000. "Plus there is the fact that the trucks are off the road for a week, which means a week of lost income."

Monita says she has spoken to other truck drivers, one of whom says he also broke his truck's springs along Brookby Road.

"This road is so dangerous," says Monita. "There are no road signs showing uneven surface or to slow down. This is an 80kmh zone where drivers are doing 100kmh. Trucks use that road every day and it's a fatal accident just waiting to happen with the lack of signs or improvement to the road. Are they waiting for a major accident before that piece of road is made safe again?"

Auckland Transport says it has repaired some of the road surface, and will undertake the remainder of the roading repairs after winter.

# Luxon shares expertise at tourism talk

National Party electoral candidate for Botany, Christopher (Chris) Luxon, shared his expertise in the travel and tourism industry at an event hosted by East Auckland Tourism last week.

The former Air New Zealand CEO discussed ways that East Auckland - including the Pohutukawa Coast and rural areas beyond - could encourage greater visitor numbers of both domestic and international travellers.

Chris said East Auckland has three characteristics that appeal to tourists - history, culture and the outdoors - and that locals need to look to successful "high value" overseas tourism concepts to get ideas.

Chris's ideas included digitising Howick Historical Village records, accentuating the historical features of Howick Village's main street, creating cultural events similar to Singapore's dragon festival, and organising sport-

ing events that would encourage people to explore our beaches and countryside.

According to Chris, once international borders re-open, New Zealand has an opportunity to attract fewer, higher quality, visitors.

Fewer visitors would ease pressure on our infrastructure and environment, while higher quality visitors keen to pay a premium for novel experiences could see tourism income increase.

East Auckland Tourism was formed in recent years with the aim of boosting the local economy by attracting tourists to the area.

At last week's meeting, the group launched a new tourism promotional video which featured local personalities including park ranger Mags Ramsey, and places of interest such as the Clevedon Farmer's Market.

# Foodie Guide

## Cauliflower Couscous

- by [foodbox.co.nz](http://foodbox.co.nz)

**Ingredients**

- 2 chicken breasts
- 1 Tbsp garam masala spice (or curry powder)
- 1 Tbsp cooking oil
- 1/2 cauliflower
- 1 cup chicken stock
- 1/2 red onion
- 1 spring onion
- 1/2 cup cashew nuts finely chopped
- juice from 1 lemon
- 1 tsp sweet chilli
- 1 packet of halloumi cheese

**Method**

1. Coat the chicken breast in garam masala (it's best to let it marinade for 30 minutes or so)
2. Fry each side of the chicken breast for 2 minutes in cooking oil, transfer into the oven, and cook covered, for 20-30 minutes.
3. In a food processor lightly blend cauliflower into the consistency of couscous.
4. Boil cauliflower in chicken stock along with one cup of boiling water for 2-4 minutes. So it is piping hot but still crunchy.
5. Finely dice red onion and spring onion and toss through cauliflower couscous, juice from 1 lemon and sweet chilli sauce.
6. Dice halloumi into 1cm cubes and quick fry for 2 minutes in oil until browned.
7. Serve couscous immediately with chicken to the side, and cashews sprinkled on top.

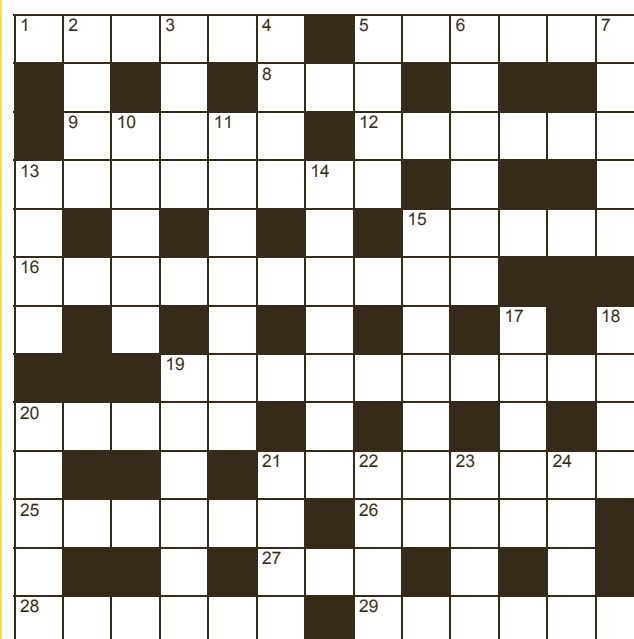

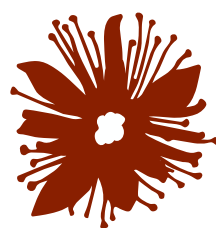
