After all, politics has as US historian Henry Adams described it, 'always been the systematic organisation of hatreds'.

It's also easy to see why Samoa and Scotland's great writer Robert Louis Stevenson described politics as 'perhaps the only profession where no preparation is thought necessary'. Quite an insight from the author of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde.

They'll be there across every media form we consume, resplendent in their colour

coded messaging to help us identify our tribe. Their bagging, culture-warring and non-stop promising will stick and the algorithms will take it from there.

'Just vote for me and all will be fixed' must rate as the most extraordinary claim any actual ordinary person could make, yet they do. Even stranger, many of us believe them only to be frustrated when they actually demonstrate their ordinariness. Happened here in Auckland last year.

Given the year we have had, the hottest and maybe for us the wettest we've had, it could be expected that preparedness for more direct climate-linked damage to lives, homes, livelihoods, infrastructure and industry across the country would feature heavily in our political discourse. Wrong.

Instead that is left to the regions and communities to address. And inevitably, to the extraordinary ordinaries. People who step up when they are needed, people others can rely on, people their communities trust. Folk just like Eddie.

If only there were more like him on the ballot come October.

Board allocates funding to community groups

Local board budgets may have been slashed as Auckland Council attempts to dig itself out of a giant fiscal hole, but a number of local organisations and events will continue to receive support over the next year.

The Franklin Local Board recently agreed to provide funding to the following groups:

- Clevedon A&P Show \$20,000
- Beachlands Maraetai Trolley Derby - \$5,000
- Clevedon Community and Business Association - \$12,000
- Takutai Charitable Trust \$12,000
- YMCA Camp Adair \$12,000

Bats were a winner at the board's last business meeting on 25 July where the board approved its 2023/2024 Infrastructure and Environmental Services work programme with its associated \$186,000 budget.

\$5,000 will be awarded to 'Finding Franklin Bats/Te rapu nag pekapeka o Franklin' to monitor the location of native bats within the area.

Other organisations to receive funding under the environmental programme were the Papakura stream restoration programme, and Predator Free Franklin/ Te Ara Hīkoi.

Brookby resident cycles length of United Kingdom

After qualifying for his senior citizen this year, where Brett rode the Alps to Gold Card earlier this year, Bookby resident Brett MacLean felt the need to push some boundaries. He packed up his bicycle and headed to the other side of the world, where he has just cycled the length of the United Kingdom.

Brett began the 2,000km journey at Lands End in Cornwall, and finished 20 days later at John O'Groats House in Scotland.

The iconic route, known as 'LEJOG', follows cycle paths and back roads through picturesque villages, moors, wooded river valleys, and past dramatic lakes, lochs and mountains.

Brett's decision to tackle LEJOG was spurred on by an Outward Bound course he attended last year.

"Outward Bound had the effect of challenging the status quo both physically and mentally," says Brett. "This linked with the fact that I was getting my Gold Card in January was quite confronting."

Brett and his wife Rebecca had already made plans to travel to the UK this year, and after attemping some of New Zealand's well-known cycleways the decision to take on LEJOG was easy.

"Having completed the Tour Aotearoa the previous year the seed was sown to do the UK equivalent. Rather than Cape Reinga to Bluff it was Lands End to John O'Groats that was on the horizon."

Training for the UK trail was done during a South Island road trip in March and April

ocean, the Coronet Loop and a gruelling one day solo ride of The Old Ghost Road.

He took his own bike from NZ to the UK. "In hindsight it was not ideal. Unlike the NZ Tour of Aotearoa, the LEJOG does not have the rough terrain requiring a robust mountain bike. 95 per cent is on either dedicated cycle paths, usually sealed, or very narrow back roads that are more like a cycle path with the odd car.

'I loved the tow paths beside canals that are now cycle paths and The Camel Trail, which is the UK equivalent to our Otago Rail Trail."

At the end of each day's ride, Brett would stay in local accommodation - often in historic pubs, where he was able to indulge his passion for craft beer.

"At the start of the ride the English summer was very hot," says Brett. "The English bitter beer hit the spot for rehydration. As I approached Scotland the UK weather had a cold snap. The wind picked up from the north, equivalent to our cold southerly, so with the hills of Scotland, pouring rain and a head wind a wee whiskey at the end of the day was needed."

He says that now it is all over, he is very forgiving of the sore behind, long days in the saddle and aching muscles. "My recollection is of stunning scenery, extremely friendly people and very considerate car drivers which makes this a 'must do' adventure."

Time to stop crime: local efforts see Clevedon security camera upgrade

Members of the Clevedon community braved hail and squalls last Wednesday evening to celebrate the installation of new security cameras in the village.

While similar projects can often take years to be realised, the input of local resident Dan Thompson saw the idea floated, funds raised and the cameras installed within just 14 weeks.

In total \$24,000 was raised - \$21,000 of which has been spent on the cameras and installation, and a further \$3,000 which will be held in reserve for maintenance.

Dan says the installation of the new system was made easier due to existing infrastructure. Five existing cameras in the village, with older technology, remain operational and three new ANPR (automatic number plate recognition) cameras have been added. The new cameras are able to scan registration plates and immediately send information to the Police helicopter and operational bases. Video footage from the cameras can be accessed remotely from anywhere.

The new system has received the thumbs up from Clevedon's new community constable Lianne Sylva and other police who say Clevedon's new surveillance technology is "up there with the best of them".

At last week's celebration, Clevedon Community and Business Association chair Victoria Richards thanked Dan

publicly for his initiative, hard work and for raising the funds required for the cameras in such a short time.

Sink or swim: local board axes school pool maintenance funding grants

Schools which have previously relied on funding grants from the Franklin Local Board to help cover their swimming pool operational costs will have to look elsewhere for funding from now on.

Swimming pool funding is one of a number of items cut from the local board budget as Auckland Council tries to claw its way out of a huge budget deficit over the next few years.

Beachlands School principal Anthony Noble-Campbell says he's very disappointed to hear the news that the Franklin Local Board will no longer be offering funding for school swimming pool maintenance, saying the funding is important within the school's budget for the running of their swimming pool over the summer holiday period.

He acknowledges this has come about through cutbacks in the overall Auckland Council budgets, but believes "the focus by Council still should be on developing abilities in young people around strengthening their swimming ability, water awareness and water safety."

"In referencing the New Zealand Drowning Prevention Report - 2022, it states that swimming is the third leading activity for drowning deaths. Tragically most people lose their lives within easy sight of the shore."

Clevedon School is also affected by the cuts. Principal Edeh Sullivan says: "We are very lucky to have managed to keep our school pool operating over the last few years. Our pool serves our children during school time, the wider community over the summer break and other schools when they've needed it.

"The funding from the council has always played a big part in allowing us to keep our pool operating and the removal of the funding will put a lot of pressure on us to continue to keep our pool open. We really hope that given the benefits of this facility to the wider community, the council will reconsider this decision. Whilst we will do our best to keep our pool open, this puts even more pressure on our already tight resources."

Franklin Local Board member Malcolm Bell says it's unfortunate the board can no longer afford to help schools with their pool operating costs, but that it's not all bad news. He says that when schools previously received funding from the board, one of the conditions was that they had to test pool water daily, incurring additional expense and manpower hours. Finding alternative sources of funding for school pool operations could mean that schools would be able to avoid such stringent testing requirements.

Talks of cutting rubbish service in half concerns councillors

Auckland Council intends to shift towards fortnightly rubbish collection but one councillor says Aucklanders might not be ready.

At the Planning, Environment and Parks Committee on 3 August, members endorsed council staff beginning to implement regionwide rates funded kerbside rubbish collection.

With members' endorsement, Auckland council's waste team will begin delivering council bins to Aucklanders who do not currently have one.

One part of the report presented to the planning committee suggested that council would reduce rubbish collection from weekly to fortnightly in the future. Councillor Daniel Newman questioned

where staff got the mandate to make such a change.

"My recollection is that we have never landed on a decision to progress to fortnightly refuse collections," Newman

"This will be judged as council charging more and cutting its service in half."

Waste Solutions general manager Parul

- by Laura Kvigstad, Auckland Sood said staff had the mandate to move to fortnightly rubbish collection from council's 2018 waste plan.

> "However, following the conversations we have had at council we said we would come back to you with evidence that the community can manage with a lesser frequency service," Sood said.

> Newman responded it was a question of whether the community can and whether they are ready.

> "There is also the issue of whether they want that to happen. If they don't want that to happen we should not necessarily oblige them by forcing this upon them."

> Chair Richard Hills said the shift to fortnightly collection would not happen without a wider discussion.

> "Part of our current waste plan is to move, at some point, to fortnightly [rubbish collection] due to the fact everyone will have food waste bins," Hills said.

> He said food waste bins would see general waste reduced over time but there was "a lot of water to go under the bridge," before then.

> Concerns over future fortnightly collection prompted Cr Daniel Newman, Cr Ken Turner, Cr Sharon Stewart and Cr Maurice Williamson to vote against



Thai Noodle Salad - by The Kai Box



INSTRUCTIONS:

- In a large pot, add in the rice noodles, cover with boiling water and cook for 4-5 minutes. Drain and rinse with cold water. Set aside.
- 2. Shred the carrots and cabbage. Rinse the edamame beans with hot water and drain. Add chopped spinach, carrots, cabbage and edamame beans to a large mixing bowl.
- 3. Make the dressing by combining all ingredients into a small bowl and whisking until well combined. Pour half the dressing over the veg and toss well to combine.
- 4. Assemble your serving bowls with a serving of noodles and top with the veggies. Drizzle with the dressing and serve with a garnish of peanuts, lime wedges and coriander.

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 carrots, peeled and shredded (grated)
- ¼ red cabbage, shredded
- 1 cup edamame beans
- ½ packet rice noodles
- · 2 handfuls baby spinach, roughly chopped
- ½ lime, cut into wedges
- ¼ cup peanuts (roughly chopped)
- · handful of coriander, roughly chopped

DRESSING:

- ¼ cup peanut butter
- 1 TBs maple syrup
- 1 TBs soy sauce
- 1 tsp sesame oil
- 1 TBs rice vinegar
- 1 tsp grated ginger
- 1-2 tsp Sriracha (optional for heat)
- 2-3 TBs warm water

History honoured at Father's Day rugby match

Clevedon's Wairoa Rangers Father's Day Tournament will return to the field this year.

Founded in 1889 (when Clevedon was known as Wairoa), the Wairoa Rangers Rugby Club is one of New Zealand's oldest rugby organisations.

In their first season they had 30 players and played the games in a paddock somewhere around McNicol Road. Later they moved their base to the Clevedon Showgrounds. The jerseys were blue and black with white shorts.

The team played their first match against Taupo Maoris (now Kawakawa Bay) on 11 May 1889. The Taupo team trekked four hours on horseback to Clevedon to play the game, before riding home after a post-game wash in the river.

That year the Wairoa Rangers also travelled by boat to play Maraetai, Pokeno, Panmure and Thames.

In 1893 the Franklin Union was formed with four clubs - Pukekohe, Tuakau, Bombay and Wairoa. The Wairoa Rangers won the first championship, and also won in 1893, 1896 and 1899. All games were traveled to on horseback with a stop off at the Jolly Farmer Inn in Drury on the way home.

Wairoa dominated the championship a few years later, winning 4 years in a row between 1911-1914. For these consecutive wins they got to keep the championship



trophy - the Hawke Cup - forever. The cup remains on display at McNicol Homestead.


Rugby stopped for the first and second world wars. Many of the players fought in the wars, and sadly some did not come

In 1923 the Wairoa Rangers Rugby Club changed its name to the Clevedon Rugby Club and played in the Manukau Sub Union. The club won championships in 1923 and 1924 then again in 1931, 1932 and the last in 1938 before closing down in 1954 because of dwindling numbers.

In 2005 the team was resurrected for Clevedon district kids to play some games of rugby on Sundays to foster community spirit - a tradition that has continued ever since with the annual Father's Day tournament.

This year's event will be held on Father's Day, Sunday 3 September.


