Proposed fill site ignites Hūnua community's concerns

A recent resource consent application for a managed fill operation at 362 Jones Road, Hūnua has prompted an outcry from local residents who gathered at the Hūnua Hall last Saturday evening to discuss the proposal.

The application, submitted to Auckland Council by Scarbro Environmental Limited, seeks approval to place 790,000m3 of managed fill material over a 10-year period on the 25-hectare rural site. Auckland Council has elected to publicly notify the application so that people can have their say.

The site contains a Significant Ecological Area which the applicant proposes to fence off, and three watercourses which are described within the application as being of low ecological value. The fill site will be established above the stream areas, and the stream areas will be planted. Sediment retention ponds will be used to filter sediment run-off from the fill areas.

While the fill site address is listed as 362 Jones Road, it is

proposed that the site will be accessed via Hūnua Road. Truck access would not be allowed from Jones Road.

Many local residents have taken to social media to express their dismay at the proposal, saying it will have a number of negative impacts on the Hūnua community. Key among these is the additional heavy vehicle traffic the site will bring to the area, with Scarbro seeking a maximum of 96 truckloads (192 truck movements in and out of the site) per day on week days, and 50 truckloads per day on Saturdays. The maximum number of trucks accessing the site in any one hour will be 20. Proposed hours of operation are Monday to Friday 7am-6pm, and 7am-1pm on Saturdays.

Residents believe the Hūnua Road location raises safety

Every three years, Councils are required by law to update the valuations of properties by which we set rates. As you can imagine, it is not feasible for us to do this on a property by property basis so we employ two independent valuation organisations to determine the valuations and it is done by way of what is called a massappraisal process where they look at recent sales within an area with that data used as the basis for determining a comparable valuation to be applied to each property within that area. They also review things such as properties that have had a building consent or undertaken a subdivision, undertake inspections of sales records to determine whether the sale has been undertaken on a willing seller, willing buyer basis and also review prior council valuation objections and ratepayer requests which occurred at the last valuation period and might point to some inaccuracies in certain areas.

The new valuations became live on the Council website on 10 June and the important thing to note is that if you believe the valuation is wrong by being either too high or too low, there is a six-week window for property owners to lodge an objection which must be received before 25 July 2025. The easiest way to find out about that is by simply searching "Auckland Council valuation objection". It should take you to the right part of the website.

This time round, residential properties have decreased by an average of around 9% since the last rating valuation in 2021. The decreases are higher than the average decrease in the central isthmus area whilst northern and southern urban areas have experienced decreases around 9%, and rural areas have experienced low, or no decreases.

Changes in valuation does not mean it changes how much Council collects in rates. Our budget sets how much we need to spend and after we have factored in non-rates funded revenue, it leaves us an amount that is divided by the number of rateable properties of all types including any differentials which determines what the rates funding for our budget needs will be.

These valuation changes just spread who pays what share of that rate funded amount. For this coming financial year the rates for the average valued residential property (\$1.29 million) is \$4,069. The 5.8 per cent rates increase equates to \$223 per year or \$4.30 per week.

We have noted this time that changes

to capital values have largely been driven by changes to land values and that areas with higher density areas have generally seen larger decreases in value.

We have decided to increase the rates rebate threshold for SuperGold card holders from \$31,510 to \$45,000 meaning more ratepayers who receive NZ superannuation will be eligible for a rates rebate.

We are also looking at a slight adjustment to the differential for farm, lifestyle and business properties to try to avoid an unintended higher overall rates burden for them. I support that. If you think it is wrong, don't forget to object.



concerns, citing crashes in the area, narrow lanes and limited visibility. Traffic consultants engaged by Scarbro say that safety improvements including tree trimming and road widening near the site entrance will reduce the risk to road users, and that the development is not expected to exacerbate the safety record within the area.

The impact on the receiving environment of 'managed fill' has also stoked local concerns, with residents worried that toxic substances may enter groundwater or local waterways. Managed fill sites may accept certain levels of contaminated waste, and locals say the application lacks details about how leachate infiltration to the underground aquifer will be avoided.

Auckland Council raised the issue of groundwater contamination with Scarbro in its request for further information, and environmental consultants Fraser Thomas responded saying the only way potential contaminants could enter waterways would be via silt/sediment runoff, or by leaching of contaminants through direct contact of groundwater with the fill material. Fraser Thomas considered there to be no potential for direct contact of the fill material with the underlying groundwater, and that all sediment runoff from fill areas would be directed to sediment removal ponds, dosed to ensure removal of any sediment. "This further supports there being negligible effects to surface water and groundwater from the placement of managed fill on the site," said Fraser Thomas.

No asbestos will be accepted at the site, and truckloads of fill will be randomly sampled to check for unauthorised contaminants.

Other concerns by locals relate to dust, noise, visual and amenity impacts.

Hunua, Ararimu and Paparimu Valley Residents Association (HAPVRA), which represents the local community, convened a meeting last Saturday at the Hūnua Community Hall. About 250 residents attended.

"This is lifechanging for many [land] owners, tears have been flowing," says

HAPVRA co-chair Geraldine Schnauer.

The public meeting was led by qualified planner and Hūnua resident Tammy Deans, who is working alongside HAPVRA on a pro bono basis (to date) to prepare HAPVRA's submission to Council.

Geraldine says that in addition to the visual, noise and value impacts, key issues raised at the meeting include potential Auckland public drinking water contamination.

"We're also concerned about the very real threat to lives with up to 192 extra truck movements a day through the Hūnua Gorge, an already treacherous piece of road, with a number of accidents already experienced on the Hūnua Road/Jones Road corner," says Geraldine.

HAPVRA is now fundraising to commission experts required to contribute to the submission and the stages that follow. A bank account for donations has been added to the HAPVRA website: https://hapvra.nz

Ngati Tamaoho has said it is not opposed to the application, provided certain environmental conditions are met. No other mana whenua groups have been

Kōkako relocated from Hūnua

Auckland's conservation community is celebrating as the Hūnua Kōkako Recovery Project translocates up to 20 kōkako to Sanctuary Mountain Maungatautari, marking the first time the Hunua Ranges population will contribute birds to another recovery project.

Once teetering on the brink of local extinction, the kōkako of the Hūnua Ranges have made an extraordinary recovery thanks to over 30 years of commitment from mana whenua, dedicated volunteers, Auckland Council, and the Department of Conservation. From a low point of just a single breeding pair and 23 individuals in 1994, the population now numbers an estimated 259 breeding pairs as of the 2022 census.

Chair of Auckland Council's Policy and Planning Committee Richard Hills says this moment is deeply emotional and symbolic.

"The haunting, melodious call of the kōkako was nearly lost forever in Hūnua.

"Thanks to three decades of perseverance and hard work by volunteers, mana whenua and council staff, we've turned that around. It is a success story that gives other conservation projects across Aotearoa huge hope and drive to keep going," says Hills.

"To go from one breeding pair to now having enough of these stunning taonga to be able to rehome some with other sanctuaries and help their population thrive, is a profound way to honour that work and help ensure $k\bar{o}kako$ thrive across New Zealand for generations to come.

"This project shows why investing time and money into our environment is so crucial, we must continue work like this into the future to protect our precious native species.

The Hūnua project is funded by Auckland Council's Natural Environment Targeted Rate, which continues to support pest control efforts, including a planned aerial 1080 operation in 2025 to sustain the hard-won progress.

The Hūnua Ranges are now recognised by the National Kōkako Recovery Programme as one of only two mainland habitats to surpass 500 birds and the project is praised for fostering strong genetic diversity. This achievement has only been possible through intensive pest control, including three aerial 1080 operations and thousands of volunteer hours maintaining 3,000 bait stations and 700 traps across rugged terrain.

Sanctuary Mountain Maungatautari, once devoid of kōkako since the 1970s, has become a stronghold for the species after earlier translocations in 2015 and 2016. A 2020 census recorded 101 territorial birds, confirming it as the fastest growing and largest mainland kōkako population established by translocation at the time.

East Auckland engineering success expands into Brookby

An East Auckland business, which manufactures and exports high-tech steel roll-forming machines whose 'rollformed' steel framing is found at the likes of Disneyland and Las Vegas hotels, is poised to set up shop in Brookby.

Howick Limited has purchased the 88acre property, formerly known as Ti Papa, at 21 Brookby Road.

Ti Papa was originally built as a world-class event venue. In its prime it contained the country's largest indoor arena which was frequently used for top level showjumping competitions. The site has since changed hands and the facilities and land have lost their former shine.

Now it seems a new lease of life will be restored to the site, thanks to Howick Limited's plans to turn the property into a manufacturing facility for its steel framing machinery which it exports to over 80 countries around the world.

The business hopes to relocate to the site in early 2026, setting up its operations within existing buildings which it plans to restore and upgrade. In the meantime a full time on-site caretaker has been employed to tidy up the site.

Howick Limited started as a small family-run workshop in 1978, and has grown into one of New Zealand's leading manufacturing success stories.

About 50 years ago father and son Keith and Bruce Coubray pivoted from

Auckland Automotive Engineering to purchase a workshop in Howick. It was a bold move prompted by the decline of the car repair trade - and it paid off.

"My grandfather and father saw the writing on the wall," says current CEO Nick Coubray. "Fixing old cars was a dying industry, so they took a leap of faith."

Joined by Bruce's brothers Rex and Alan, the business became a family affair. Today, Nick and his brother Hamish coown Howick Ltd alongside their father.

In the 1980s, Howick Ltd shifted from general engineering to specialist manufacturing, designing their first refrigeration tube-bending machine for Fisher & Paykel in 1987. By 1996, the company had fully committed to producing steel roll-forming machines for the construction industry. The rollforming process manufactures lightweight steel components that are used to create framing systems such as wall framing, floors and trusses for faster and more efficient builds.

"We went from being a local workshop to an international player in construction technology," Nick explains. "That decision changed everything."

Howick Ltd's machines have helped shape landmark buildings including Buckingham Palace, London's Shard, Las Vegas hotels, and attractions at Disney and

Universal Studios. They export 95% of their machines to markets across the US, UK, Europe, and Australia.

Business has boomed to the point where they have outgrown their current facility. They expect to continue to grow from 50 to 100 staff in the coming years, employing people in a variety of high-value roles including programmers, design engineers, electricians, fitter turners, CNC operators, apprentices, and machine assemblers which they say will have a flow-on effect of more employment opportunities for locals.

Extra in your pocket: easy steps to claim your Entrust dividend

Entrust's annual dividend payment will be made in late September to more than 368,000 households and businesses in central, east, and south Auckland.

To ensure the dividend is received without delay, eligible power account holders within the Entrust District should look out for their Entrust pack, out this week, and check that their details are correct.

What do I need to do?

Look out for information from Entrust in your letterbox or email inbox. Check the payment details showing on the form or email. If you need to fill in or update those details, just follow the instructions and return the information to Entrust by Friday 08 August 2025.

How do I update my payment details?

Payment updates can be made online at our secure web page at www.entrustnz. co.nz

Instructions on how to use the secure web page are in the form or email sent out by Entrust. Or return the form by email or post (postage free). Please send your form once only.

What are my payment options?

When you receive your Entrust payment preference form or email you can choose whether you want the September dividend payment credited to your bank account or your power account.

What is the Entrust dividend?

Entrust (formerly called the Auckland Energy Consumer Trust), is a private trust that owns the majority of Vector on behalf of its beneficiaries.

Entrust owns 75.1% of shares in Vector which are held in trust for energy consumer beneficiaries in central, east, and south Auckland. These beneficiaries are paid a dividend each year, usually in late September.

The Entrust dividend is New Zealand's largest dividend pay-out, with over \$2 billion paid out to Aucklanders since 1994. The Entrust District includes central, east, and south Auckland.

How do I know if I'll get the dividend? You need to meet three conditions to be eligible for the Entrust dividend:

- being in the Entrust District on the roll date AND
- paying Vector electricity lines charges as part of your power bill AND
- being the person named on the power bill

For those who are not sure if they are eligible for this payment, there is a map and list of eligibility criteria along with FAOs at www.entrustnz.co.nz

What is the 2025 roll date?

It is near the dividend payment date but for security reasons the exact roll date is not disclosed in advance.

When do I get my dividend?

The 2025 Entrust dividend will be paid in late September to eligible Entrust beneficiaries. **How much is the dividend this year?** The dividend amount varies each year as

it is based on the annual profits generated by Vector, of which Entrust is the majority shareholder. Last year, the dividend was \$350.

What do I need to do right now?

Check your letterbox or email inbox for your payment preference form and instructions to access the secure web page.

Check the payment details showing on the form or email. If you need to fill in or update those details, just follow the instructions and return the information to Entrust by Friday 08 August 2025.

If you are using the secure web page, instructions are on the form or email. You'll need to have your ICP number handy. You can find that on your power bill.

If you are using the form, fill it in and post or email it back to Entrust. A freepost envelope is included with all postal forms, or email forms back to form@entrustdividend.co.nz

I have received my form or email and all details are correct, do I need to send it back?

No, Entrust only needs you to let us know if you are filling in, updating or changing your payment details. So, if it's all good, you don't need to go to the secure web page or send the form back. If your payment details are incorrect, or there are no payment details on your form or on the secure web page, then it is very important





Why it's important to tackle pest plants

[Over the coming months the PC Times will publish a series of articles focusing on local environmental issues, written by Year 10 student Eleanor Vogel who is undertaking this project as part of her Duke of Edinburgh qualifications.

In New Zealand, we love our flora and fauna. But are we doing enough to protect it? While it is very important to trap pest animals, there is also another growing threat: pest plants.

Pest plants are non-native, invasive species that grow aggressively and spread quickly, often overwhelming native plants while disrupting ecosystems. Pest plants include all types; climbing/ smothering plants, groundcover/shrubs, trees and coastal invasive plants.

When pest plants are introduced to an ecosystem, they will harm the native plants either by smothering or by soaking up nitrogen, phosphorus, and other essential nutrients from the soil and starving the native plants around them to death. We can even see the impact of this in our gardens - for example, moth plants. They will smother feijoa trees, young manuka, flax and more.

These pest plants don't only affect others of their kind though - they also affect native animals in the area. As they replace the vegetation, they are also replacing homes for weta, geckos and birds, leaving these species very little time to adapt. Piwakawaka rely on dense native shrubs to nest, but without these they are left exposed to predators and the weather. With little time to change their habits, they are often left without a home.

So, what can we do? To start, we can learn to identify pest plants. Once we know this, we can remove them from our gardens to help stop them spreading and encourage the growth of native plants. We can also join local weeding days to help stop them in the forests. Websites like weedbusters.org. nz provide great guides for beginners. Every pest plant we remove is one step closer to protecting New Zealand's unique natural environment.

A common pest plant in New Zealand backyards is the moth plant. Here is a step-by-step guide on how to get rid of it. You don't have to take the entire weed out, which is a common misconception, all you need to do is follow these simple steps:

Find the tap root (main root of the plant), and snip it. Remove all seed pods (if any), place them in a plastic bag and throw them in the rubbish.

Paint the tap-root cut with weed gel to ensure that it doesn't grow again.
